

Who is Eligible to Participate

- Students who are school age (16-18 years of age as of July 1st of the current school year) and enrolled in a District Secondary school or DL Program
- Some programs require a formal application and interview process through the school counselor or career facilitator.
- Students enrolling in academic courses require a recommendation from counselors or school administration.



How Do I Apply and Register for an Individual Course or Program

- Talk with your school counselor, career facilitator or Principal/VP and register for courses and career programs through your school.
- Take advantage of these opportunities in your grade 11 and 12 years.
- Register for a course or a complete program.

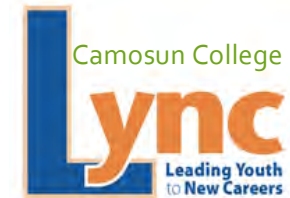

Dual Credit

What is Dual Credit

Dual Credit courses and programs allow motivated secondary school students the opportunity to begin career training in trades, technical programs and first year university courses prior to graduation. Students who participate in this early entry receive credit towards their Grade 12 graduation requirements as well as University or College credit.

The Ministry of Education funds tuition, as courses are eligible for graduation credit.
