

Using Airplay with iOS & MacOS

This guidance is meant for teachers & staff using district issued technology in their classroom.

Mirroring your screen from MacOS

MacOS has a feature called Airplay which you can use to broadcast the screen of your Mac to your classroom TV. Please follow this guide for guidance on mirroring your device to your TV.

Recommended for

Low bandwidth activities.. showing documents, pictures, slides.

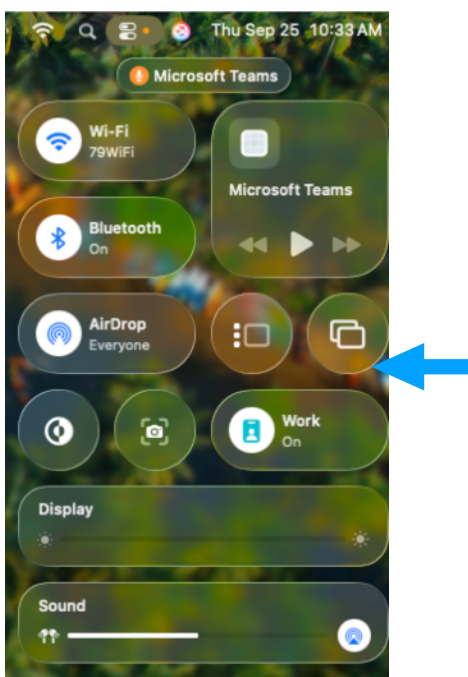
Not recommended for

Playing videos, streaming music.

1.) On your Macbook, navigate to the top right hand corner of your screen and click the Control Centre Icon. (Your icon may look different depending on your version of MacOS).



2.) From the Control Centre menu, click the Screen Mirroring button.



3.) From the Screen Mirroring menu, look for your Classroom TV (eg: ATV Rm229). In this example, we're connecting to the Creativity room ATV.



4.) On your classroom TV, you'll see a randomly generated 4 digit code. Enter this on your Mac to confirm the connection.



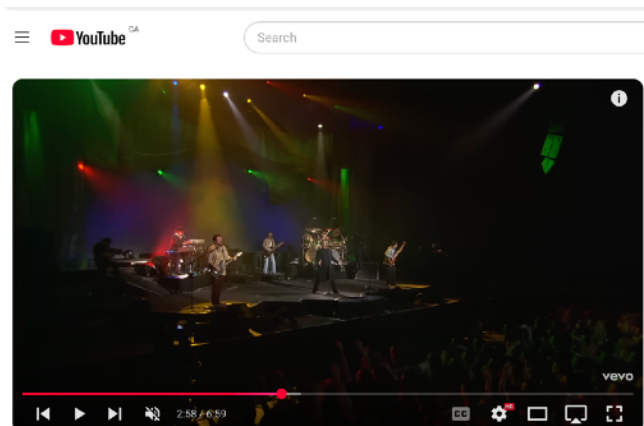
5.) You can repeat this process in reverse to disconnect from the TV.

Streaming video/audio from MacOS

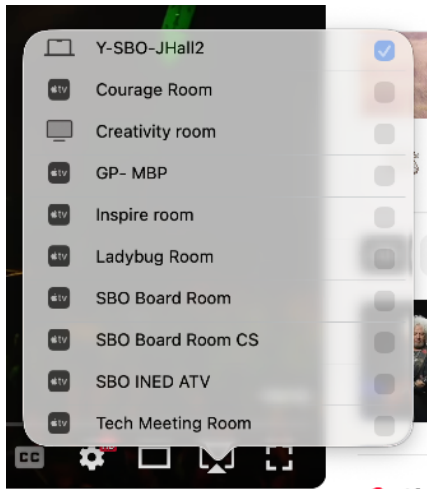
While Screen Mirroring is great for slides/static images, if you're wanting to share audio or video from your Mac, please follow this process.

Recommended for
Playing videos, streaming music.

1.) If you're streaming videos, you must use Safari. We'll go to Youtube for this example.



2.) Tap on the Airplay Icon. From the menu, look for and choose your classroom Apple TV. If prompted, enter the randomized 4 digit pin on your classroom TV.



3.) The video will begin to stream on your classroom TV. You can pause, etc from your Mac. To stop streaming, click the Airplay button on the Youtube video again and uncheck the Apple TV. This can be done similarly from Audio apps such as Apple Music.

Mirroring your screen from iOS

1.) On your iPad pull down from the top right hand corner of your screen. The Control Centre menu will appear.



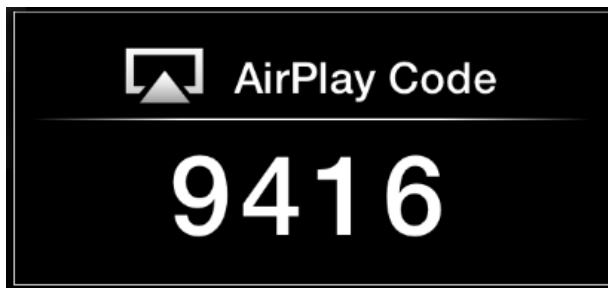
2.) From the Control Centre menu, tap the Screen Mirroring button.



3.) From the Screen Mirroring menu, look for your Classroom TV (eg: ATV Rm229). In this example, we're connecting to the Courage room ATV.



4.) On your classroom TV, you'll see a randomly generated 4 digit code. Enter this on your iPad to confirm the connection.



5.) You can repeat this process in reverse to disconnect from the TV.

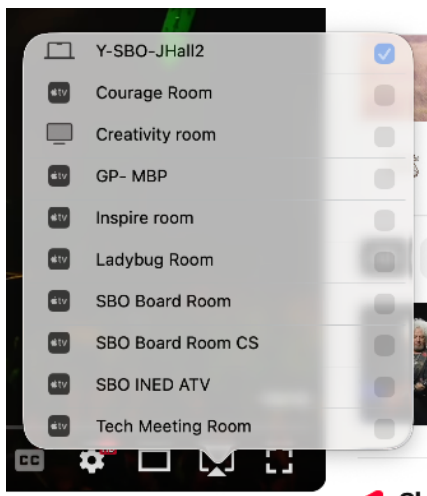
Streaming video/audio from iOS
