Janet Ruest – National Geographic Educator/Prime Minister's Award for Teaching Excellence – Trustee Hutchins introduced Janet Ruest, from Chemainus Secondary School, who has been recognized for two different accomplishments. Recently Janet has become a National Geographic Certified Educator. This accomplishment shows a commitment by a teacher to teach their students about the world and how it works, empowering them to succeed and make it a better place. This past month also brought the accolades of a Certificate of Achievement for the Prime Minister's Award for Teaching Excellence. This was awarded to Janet for being a teacher who fosters the growth of curiosity and thirst for knowledge, encouraging students to evaluate issues by examining the moral and ethical decisions made in the past. Trustee Hutchins expressed congratulations to Janet and thanked her for her contributions to the School District.

Brian Johnston – BC Soccer Youth Coach of the Year – Trustee de Groot introduced Brian Johnston from Frances Kelsey Secondary School, who has been named by BC Soccer as the 2016-17 Youth Coach of the Year in appreciation of his contributions to soccer. Brian received the award for his contributions throughout the past year. This is a province wide award for coaching community and school Soccer. Trustee de Groot congratulated Brian and thanked him for his contributions.

Academy Fees for 2017-2018 – As the Hockey Academy at Frances Kelsey Secondary School meets the Ministry of Education criteria for a Specialty Academy, the Board of Education passed a motion approving the 2017-2018 Activity Fee of \$1,200.00.

National Aboriginal Day – The Board of Education passed a motion recognizing National Aboriginal Day on June 21, 2017. Events will be taking place in local schools and throughout the community on that day.

Student Learning Grant – After receiving consultation data from meetings with partner groups, PACs, teaching staff and Principals/Vice-Principals, the Board of Education passed a motion for the grant to be distributed on a per capita basis, with funds spent to align with Ministry of Education specifications. Schools will determine how the funding can best support their students and grant funding is to be used to purchase sustainable and non-consumable items that will benefit the school in times to come.

Local Government Bylaw Zoning – Trustees continue to be concerned about local governments approving marijuana dispensaries near school properties and passed a motion to write a letter requesting that they develop policies similar to other jurisdictions banning dispensary approval.

Residential Development – Trustees passed a motion to write to Local Governments requesting that developers set aside land for schools in areas where there is an anticipated large population increase in family housing.

Education

District Update – The Superintendent reported on the following items around the district:

District Scholarships - Just under 90 students participated in the District Scholarship Presentations held at each of the district secondary schools and CVOLC during the week of May 29th to June 2nd. Topics of the presentations ranged from physical activity, community service, fine arts, technology and trades, international language, and applied design, science and technology. This year there are 63 awards valued at \$1250 each for a total of \$78,750. Winners will be announced at their schools' awards presentations.

Hector McIntosh Speaking Competition - The finals of the 36th Annual Hector McIntosh Public Speaking Competition were held on May 15th. SD79 schools did great again this year. The results were as follows:

Business

2017-2018 Capital Plan Bylaw – The Board of Education gave three readings and passed a motion approving Capital Bylaw No. 17-01 Capital Plan 2017-2018. While in the past separate bylaws have been required for projects, the Ministry of Education has determined that one bylaw encompassing the entire approved plan is required.

2018-2019 Capital Plan – The Secretary-Treasurer presented the 2018-2019 Capital Plan prepared for Trustee review and approval. A replacement Cowichan Secondary School remained the first priority, with other projects including re-roofing, seismic mitigation, heating/boiler replacements, HVAC system upgrades and a school bus replacement. During the Closed Board Meeting prior, the Board of Education authorized a demographic study of the district to identify where future growth in the Cowichan Valley will take place and its subsequent implications for schools.
